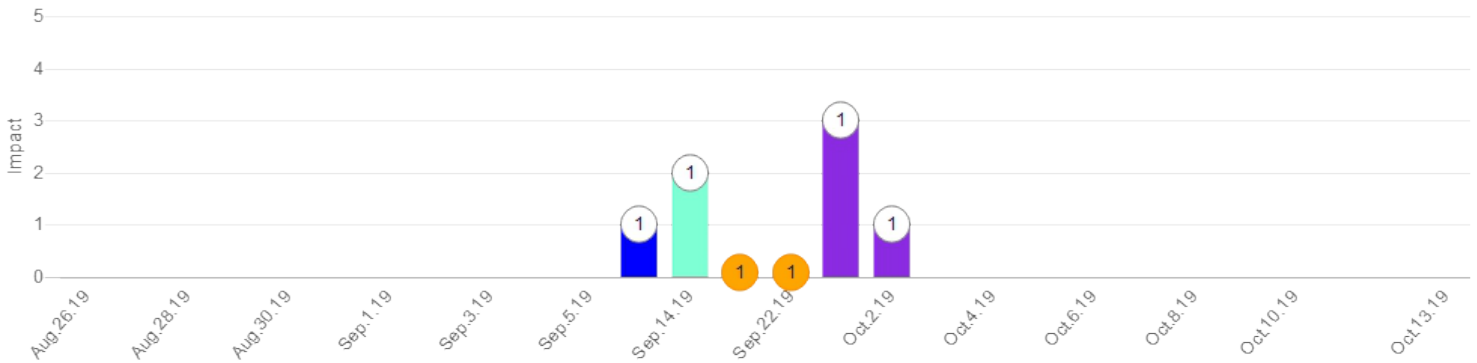


Contact Case 2 - An Other
