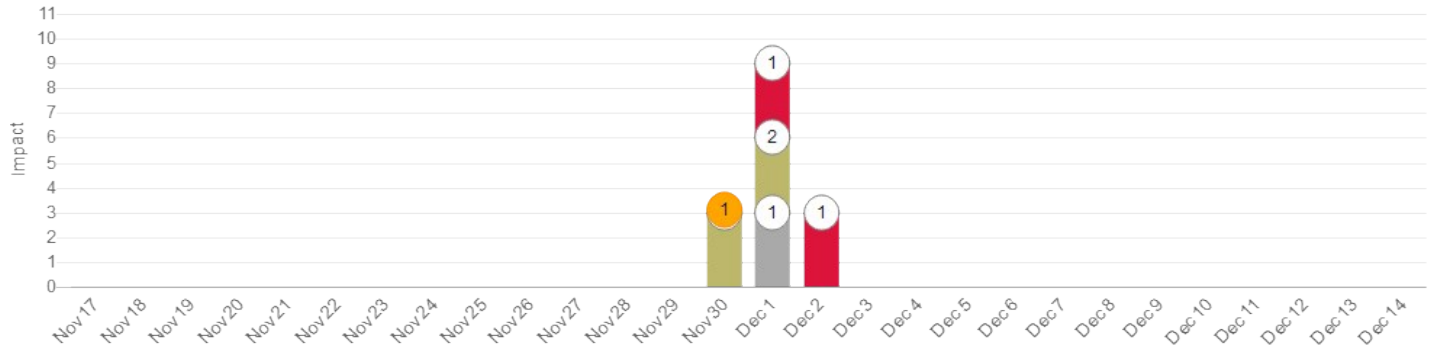

I gave an account of the deterioration in T's behaviour and it's impact on us as a family. He'd been fine for a long time when he was first placed with us and after his adoption. It's only really worsened since strting senior school in September and us showing him some of the cards and letters we'd saved from his mum. J, our birth son seems to be coping better than our daughter J who is frightened of him. He's a big tall boy now who seems to enjoy seeing us scared. Dr S said it was important to keep a record of what's happening and it's impact on us. She'll send out an appointment letter soon. - Impact 0

95	30/11/2017 17:00	An Other	3	T got back from school and slammed the front door as he came in. He ran upstairs slammed his bedroom door and put some music on. We could hear it through the house and he was banging about in his room. I'm at the end of my tether after last week and feeling a bit frightened. I had contacted the psychologist T sees at the CAMHS service this morning and she suggested I keep a record of T's behaviour. After about 40 mins I went upstairs to T's room. By then our other children had eaten their tea. I asked T to come downstairs to eat. He told me to 'F off you witch' and said that he'd got a burger on his way home as everything I cooked is 'shit'. I left him and waited for my husband to come home. We then both went to T's room and after a lot of placating T came downstairs and watched some tv with our other children. The atmosphere is really bad and we are all very cautious around T when he's like this. Our daughter is very wary of T and has started to lock her bedroom door at night. - Impact 3

T had 'attacked' another boy who'd had to be taken to hospital. That's why he couldn't ring sooner. The boy had bruises on his face and body. T had left the school shortly afterwards. The boys parents are going to the police. Mr B said that T's behaviour was getting worse. He could be 'a very nice lad' but sometimes he was out of control and very frightening. He is having an impact on the children in his class. We have to see the headmaster early next week. - Impact 3

We told him the police would be involved. He didn't seem at all worried about that saying his dad was 'always in trouble with the feds'. We told T he was going to be grounded all weekend and would not go to the match. He flew at us both, pushed me onto the sofa and hit my husband in the face. He said we weren't his 'real parents' and couldn't tell him 'f all'. We ran out of the house. Our daughter was in the corner of the sitting room watching this.
